THE WATER CYCLE

The water cycle, also known as the hydrological cycle, describes the continuous movement of water on, above, and below the surface of the Earth. This cycle is driven by solar energy and gravity, ensuring that water is constantly recycled and reused.

The cycle begins with evaporation, where water from oceans, rivers, and lakes turns into water vapor due to the heat from the Sun. This water vapor rises into the atmosphere and cools down, leading to condensation. During condensation, the water vapor turns into tiny droplets that form clouds. When these droplets combine and grow heavy enough, they fall back to the Earth's surface as precipitation, which can be in the form of rain, snow, sleet, or hail.

Once the water reaches the ground, it can take several paths. It might infiltrate into the soil and replenish groundwater supplies, run off into rivers and streams, or return to large bodies of water like lakes and oceans. Plants also play a role in the water cycle through a process called transpiration, where they release water vapor from their leaves into the atmosphere.

The water cycle is crucial for maintaining life on Earth, as it distributes water across different parts of the planet, supporting ecosystems and human activities.

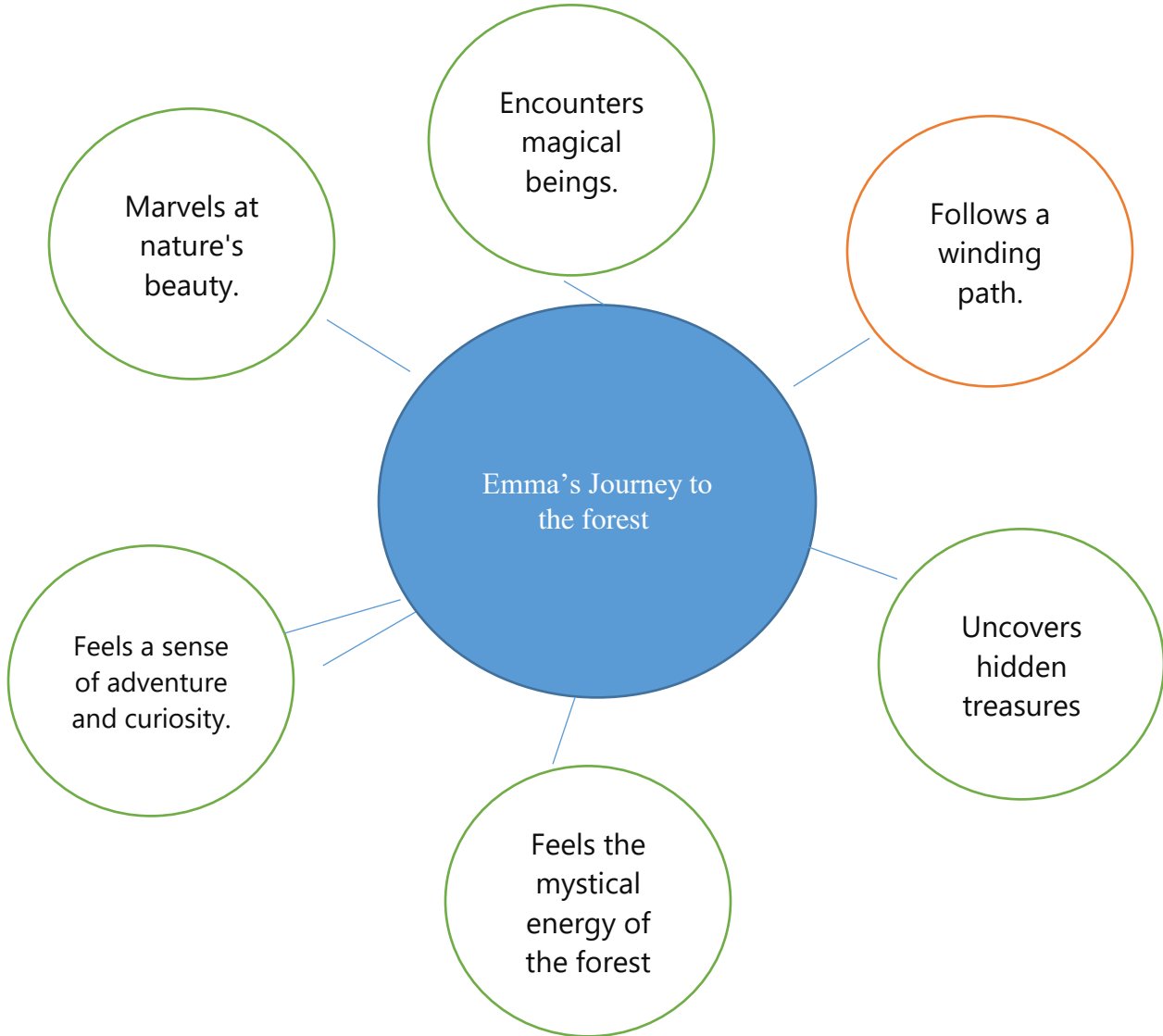
