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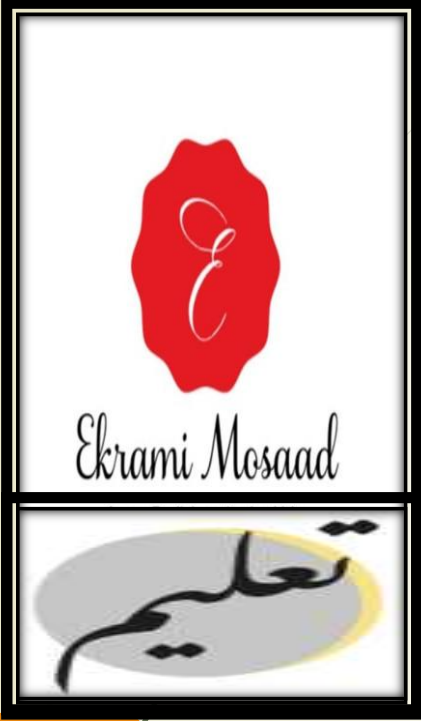

A **simple sentence** is a sentence that has one subject-verb pair.

The word *simple* in “simple sentence” doesn’t mean “easy.” It means “one subject-verb pair.”

The subject in a simple sentence may be compound:¹

My brother and I are completely different.

The verb in a simple sentence may be compound:

They **laughed and cried** at the same time.

However, each sentence is a simple sentence because it has only one subject-verb pair.



There are many variations, but each sentence has only one SV pair.

In my viewpoint, a positive role model has the ability to shape the views, ideas, and actions of a young person.





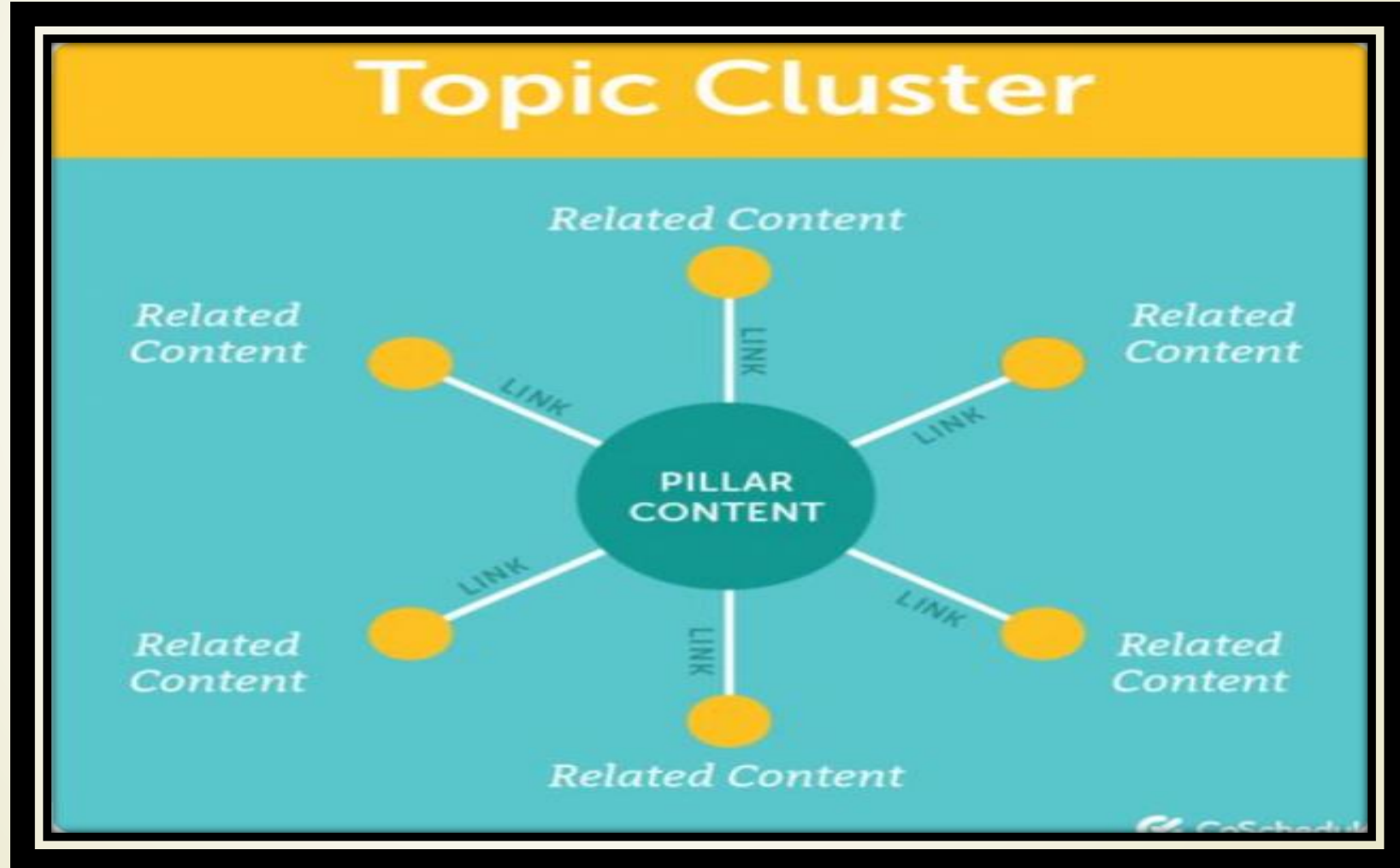

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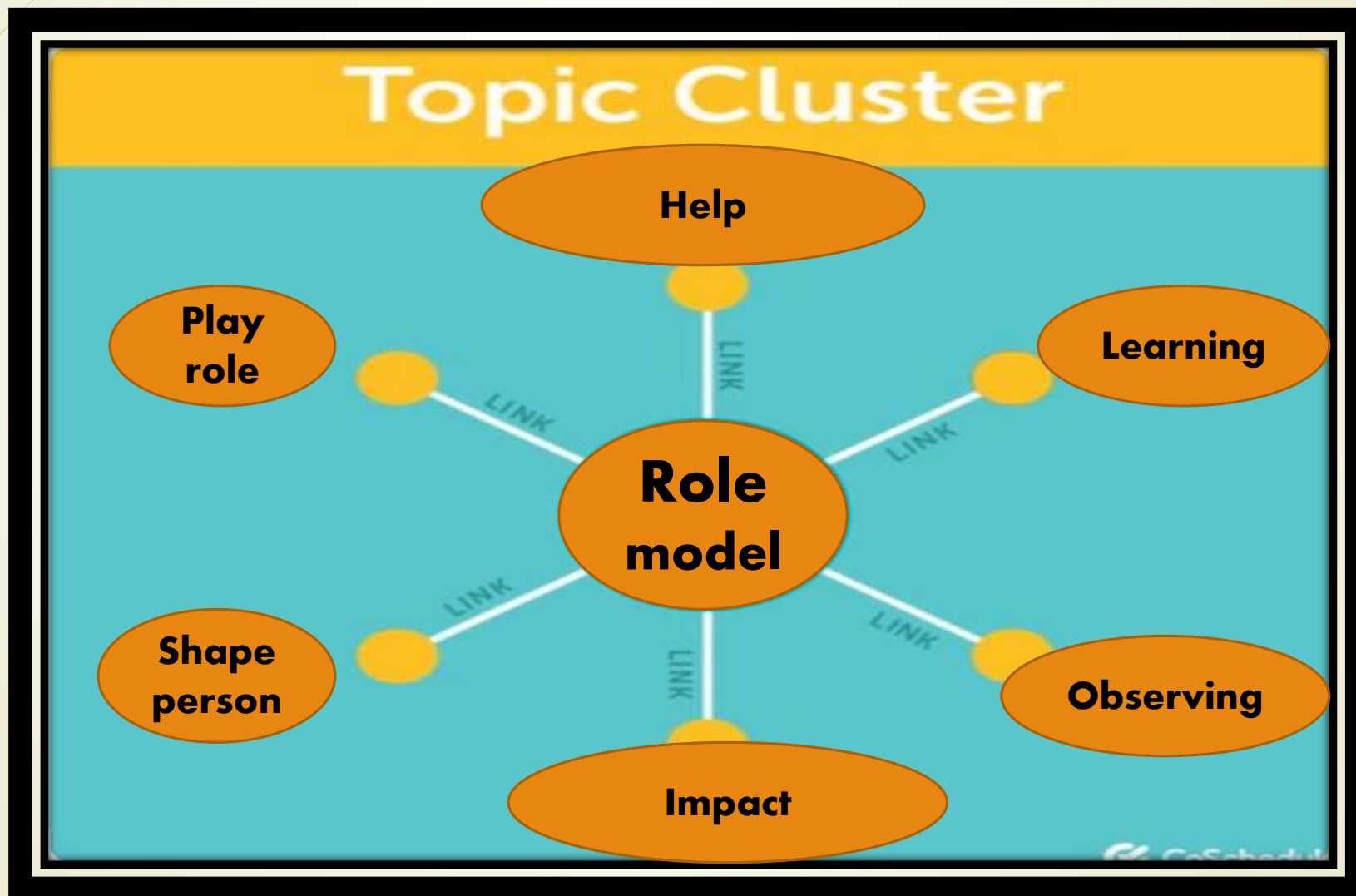

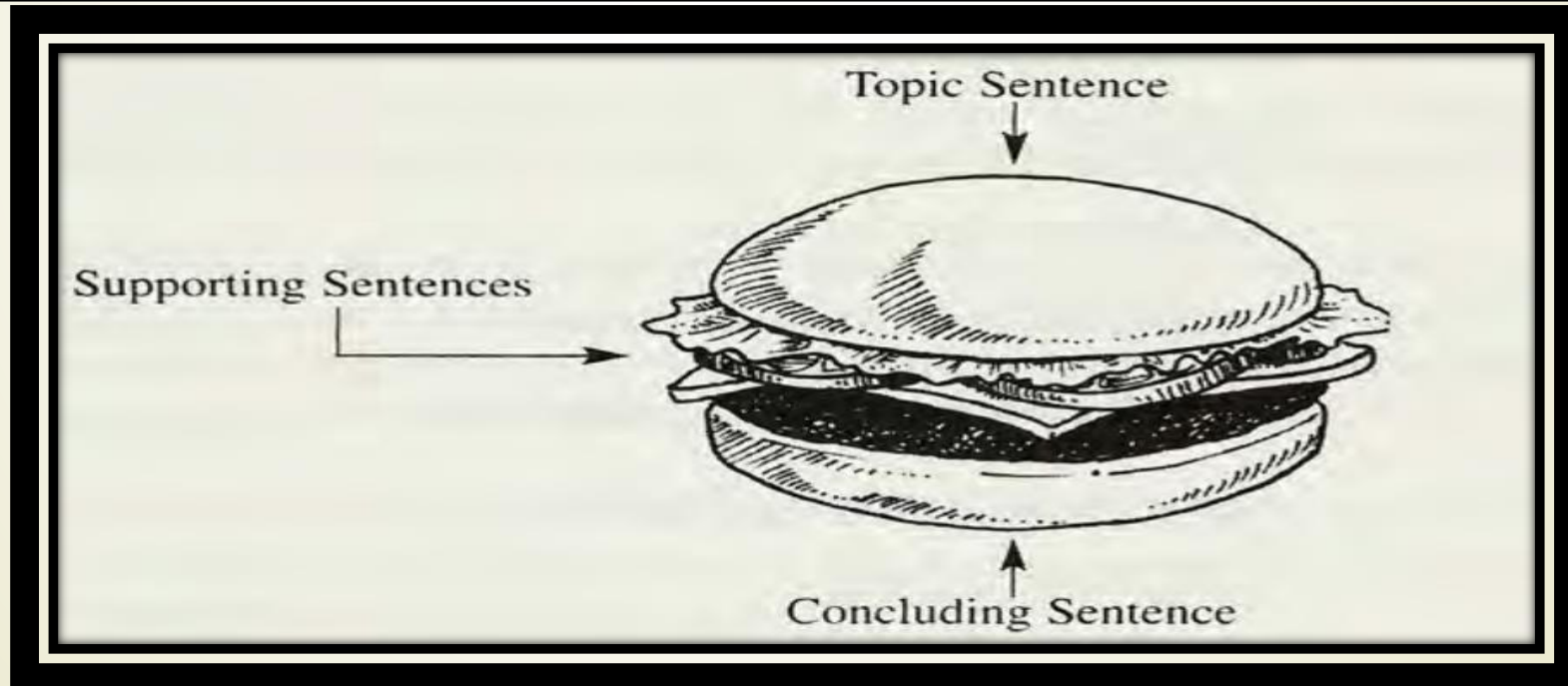
